UVA Scarf


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If you need this pattern formatted differently or if you have any questions, please email me!

Yardage: ~150 yds each MC and CC Guage: 15 stitches x 22 rows = 4" x 4"



Cast on 33 stitches with both MC and CC yarn together. Try hard to keep the colors in the same order throughout (ie, MC on right, CC on left).

With MC, knit into MC loop. With CC, purl into CC loop. Continue to end of row. You should now have 66 stitches.

When you turn, you'll be facing the CC side. Knit into CC loops with CC, purl into MC loops with MC.

Be sure at the start of each row to twist the yarn so it doesn't come undone at the edges.

Knit 1 more row then begin chart 1.

After completion of chart 1, switch back to background color for each side and stitch straight for 5".

Begin Chart 2 (note: I moved the "U" up by one stitch). Keep in mind that if you want the letters legible from both sides, you must knit your MC side by the chart and your CC side in mirror (this will lead to some confusing moments, but I have faith in all of you).

Next, either stitch straight 5" and begin chart 1 again, knit three rows, then bind off loosely **OR** knit straight 5", add horizontal name lettering (I recommend 4" wide or so), stitch straight 1", knit chart 1, knit three rows, then bind off loosely.

Make fringe either by mixing the two colors together or doing them individually colored each tassel and wrapping around a dvd case (to get them all the same length). Take a bunch of 10 lengths of yarn and cut at one end. Using a crochet hook, loop tassels through the ends of the scarf.
